

BYE-LAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS

OF:

"The Riverton Cemetery Company,"

1. There shall be an Annual Meeting of the shareholders on the first Monday of April, in every year; and due notice thereof shall be given. At such meetings the Secretary and Treasurer shall present the Accounts of the Company, and a Report of their affairs generally and the officers shall be elected at the Annual Meetings but vacancies may be filled at any Special Meeting. Special Meetings may be called at any time, on the requisition in writing of three or more Shareholders.

2. Every Lot-holder shall, upon application to the Secretary, have his or her lot defined and bounds thereof staked.

3. The Proprietors of said lots shall have the right to cultivate trees, shrubs and plants thereon, or otherwise improve or ornament the same in a suitable manner, but no tree growing within the lots shall be cut down or destroyed without the consent of the Committee.

4. The Company have no wish to interfere with the taste of individuals in regard to the style of their improvements; but yet in justice to the interests of the whole they reserve to themselves the right of preventing or removing any erection or enclosure which they shall consider injurious to the immediate beauty, or prejudicial to the general good appearance of the grounds; and also of removing or pruning any trees or shrubbery which may obstruct, or mar the effect and beauty of the scenery, or may otherwise prove injurious, unsightly, or detrimental.

5. Persons injuring any of the growing trees or shrubbery on the Cemetery grounds; or defacing or injuring any of the tombstones or graves, or any other property in the Cemetery or otherwise trespassing thereon, shall be prosecuted for each offence according to law.

6. All graves for adults shall not be less than five feet deep, and for children not less than four.

7. In excavating for graves or for any purpose on any lot care shall be taken by the owner of said lot to avoid the putting of any earth or sods on the paths or roads or lots; but shall have all refuse or debris removed out of the Cemetery.

8. Any person who shall bury, or erect a monument or cenotaph, on any lot or portion of lot than the one owned by him or her as shown on the plan of said

Cemetery, shall upon notice from the Sec'y, or any other Trustee have the same removed; and in failing to do so after five days notice, the Trustees may have the same removed to the lot owned by the said party, and all expenses incurred in said removal shall be paid by the owner of said lot.

9. No Lot-holder shall erect or cause to have erected any fence around his or her lot.

10. Any lot dressed or cleaned otherwise than that done by the Cemetery Co., shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees.

11. No transfer of lots shall be permitted while assessments remain unpaid on said lot, and then by the consent of the Sec'y who shall note the change on the plan.

12. The proceeds of the sale of lots shall be expended for the benefit of the Cemetery under the direction of the Committee.

13. No person shall be allowed to be buried in the said Cemetery who shall have been executed for any crime.

14. The foregoing Bye-Laws and Regulations shall not be altered or amended, except at an annual or special meeting of the Company, and notice thereof given; and no such alteration, addition or amendment shall be made unless concurred in by at least two-thirds of the Shareholders present at such meeting.

The foregoing Bye-Laws, Rules and Regulations were duly passed at a special meeting of the Shareholders of "the Riverton Cemetery Company" held on the day of June, A. D., 1890.
